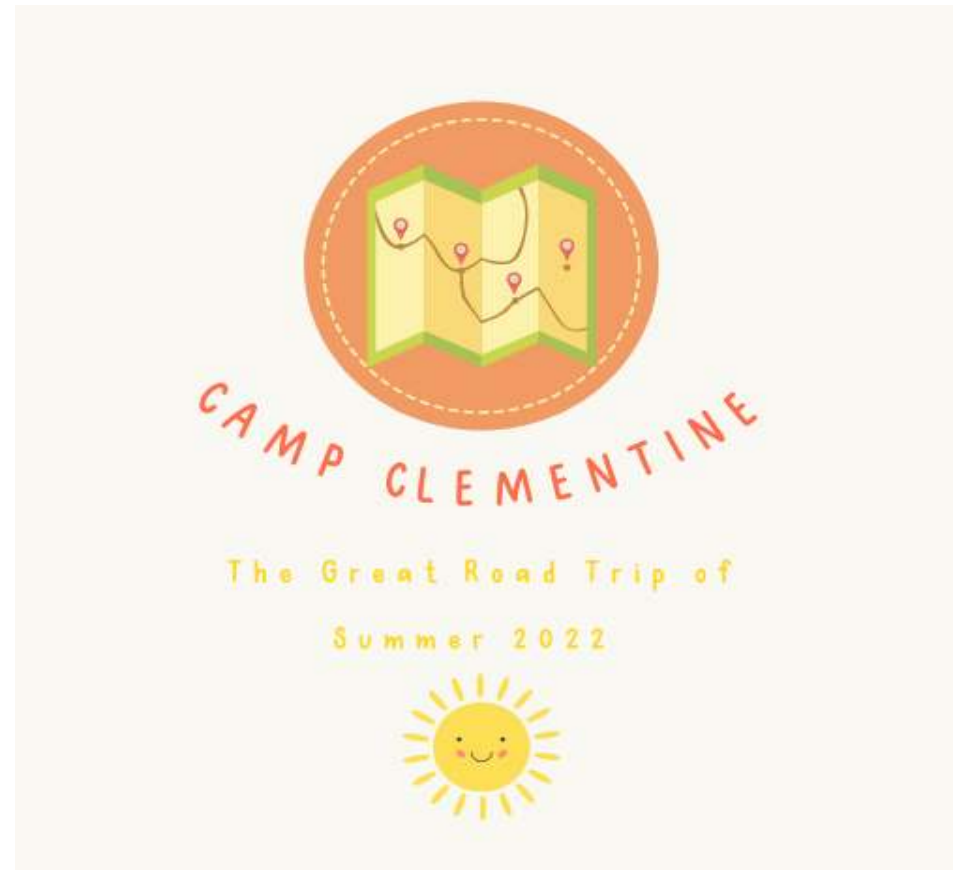


CAMP REGISTRATION:

- Camp Clementine will run from June 21st through August 26th.
- We will maintain one pod with a maximum of **18 campers**.
 - *To preserve our pod, we are requiring families to enroll for the full ten weeks of camp.*
- Camp Clementine will first be open to all students currently enrolled for the upcoming 2022 - 2023 school year.
- After February 25th, camp enrollment will open to current students who are not returning for the 2022 - 2023 school year based on availability.
- All campers must be at least 3 years old when they start and must be toileting completely independently.
- Registration is accepted on a first come, first served basis.
- Camp tuition is payable by check to Clementine Montessori School and will be billed over 3 months - April, May, & June.
- No refunds will be given.

Weeks 1 + 2

The Southwest

June 21 - 24 / June 27 - July 1

We will kick off our first two weeks of camp in the Southwest. We will start in Galveston, Texas with activities and stories to honor Juneteenth. We will then head west to Colorado and Utah to dig for dinosaur fossils before heading further west to explore the many deserts of Nevada. We wrap-up our southwest road trip by exploring the terrain of the expansive Grand Canyon.

Weeks 3 + 4

The West

July 5 - 8 / July 11 - 15

As we continue to travel through the deserts of Nevada and into California, we discover the captivating and beautiful geodes. There are also many of the beautiful National Parks to explore, including

Yellowstone and Olympic National Parks, where we will go on a "Bear Hunt" adventure and track the many different animals that we find along the way. We will then reach the Pacific Ocean, which means peaceful sea, and explore many amazing wonders including its volcanoes and the Mariana Trench.

Weeks 5 + 6

The Midwest

July 18 - 22 / July 25 - 29

We will jump on the exciting and historic Route 66 heading toward the Midwest. We arrive in America's heartland where we will explore the many facets of our farming sector through cooking science and art activities. We will then travel north to tour the Great Lakes and study its habitat before we head to Chicago to visit the windy city.

Week 7 + 8

The Southeast

August 1 - 5 / August 8 - 12

On our 7th & 8th week of our road trip, travel with us to the southeastern region of the United States. We will start by discovering Florida's amazing coral reefs and the abundant fresh and saltwater life. We will then make our way west to New Orleans where we will experience the eclectic music genres. Hop on a Mississippi barge to explore the abundant migrant bird life. Swinging by Georgia, the peach state, we will get our hands dirty as we harvest some fruits and vegetables.

Weeks 9 + 10

The Northeast

August 15 - 19 / August 22 - 26

Onward and upward as we travel to the Northeast. We will learn about the oldest living fossil, the horseshoe crab as well as other species residing in the Atlantic Ocean. Heading south, we will travel around Manhattan and discover through our own experiments, what makes the Statue of Liberty green. We will create our own boats that will land us right back here in our hometown of Philadelphia! We will paint murals, create mosaics and end the summer with a big splash. **Program is subject to change*
