Eligibility Requirements

- Students currently enrolled for the upcoming 2024- 2025 school will be prioritized.
- Students not returning to Clementine in the fall of 2024 may enroll as of February 20th based on availability (with the exception of those graduating in June).
- All primary campers must be at least 3 years old when they start and must be toileting completely independently.
- Students between 18 months and 3 years old and those not yet potty trained may join our toddler program.

• Registration is accepted on a first come, first served basis.


