All campers must be:

Week 1 - The World

June 23-27

Week 3 - South America

July 7-11

Week 4 - Europe

July 14-18

Week 5 - Asia

July 21-25

Campers will try their hand at Sumi-e, traditional Japanese ink printing. Journeying inwards, we will learn about meditation and movement practices from India. Including a visit from Noble Heart Yoga.

Week 6 - Africa

July 28-August 1

Ghanaian Kente cloth will inspire the creation of colorful fabrics and beads. After learning about the construction and history of djembe drums, campers will make their own percussive instruments. *Including a visit from Mlanjeni Magical Theater.*

Week 7 - Australia

August 4-8

Students will try their hand at pottery and rock painting in the style of the Aborigines people. We will uncover the wonders of the Great Barrier Reef. Including a visit from Critter Connection.

Week 8 - Antarctica

August 11-15

Camp will get a whole lot chillier as we explore the vast desert of Antarctica, and learn of the furry friends who never catch a cold. Including a visit from the Kona Ice Food Truck.
